TICKET SALES

- No cash transactions will be available.
- Tickets are required for school-age children kindergarten through 12th grade
- All ticket sales will be online through Hometown Tickets at <https://www.cha.org/athletics/tickets.cfm>
- Pre-sale for *participants with the passcode* begins at *8am the day BEFORE* the game.
- A maximum of 4 tickets can be purchased per participant. Participants parents/guardians have access to purchase tickets via a passcode received from their Athletic Office.
- After the pre-sale, any remaining tickets will open up to the General Public at 12pm on the day of the game.
- If available, tickets can be purchased on a mobile device by using the QR code at the gate
- Please SCAN-IN your ticket at EAST entrance only

Basketball Safety Protocols

Welcome to our facilities here at Christian Heritage Academy. Given the current state of COVID-19, it is our desire to create an environment that is conducive to slowing down the spread of the virus and encourage good health and safety practices for all who enter our facility. We also have limitations in place to help us accomplish this and limit exposure. We appreciate your help with the following limitations and guidelines when you are at our facilities.

***** Modified by Governor Stitt Executive Order December 10th, 2020**

- **Attendance at youth indoor sporting events will be limited to four spectators per participant or 50% of the building's capacity, whichever is lower.**

Seating:

- Visitors seating (north bleachers)
- We will not allow seating on the first row of bleachers closest to the floor.
- Seating will be limited to every other row.
- Non-seating rows will be clearly marked.

Masks:

- Coaches, players, and officials will not be required to wear masks on the court.
- For non-participants, **masks will be required at all times** during the games unless eating or taking a drink. Please, do not lengthen your eating time to circumvent the rule.
- Announcements will be made over the PA system by an administrator if it is noticed masks are not being worn.
- If individuals continue to not wear masks, then they will be kindly asked to exit the facility.

Locker rooms:

- Locker rooms will be available for use by visiting teams. The visiting school can determine whether to use those facilities or not. Locker rooms will be cleaned prior to the visiting team use of the locker room.

Ball Sanitizing:

- Balls will be sanitized prior to each game.
- We will also use a six-ball rotation during all games.

Players Bench:

- Masks are not required on the team benches or during team huddles.
- Visiting schools can determine whether their coaches/players wear masks on the benches and in team huddles.

Cheer:

- Each team will be limited to 8 cheerleaders on the court. Additional cheerleaders in the stands will count toward the total number of seats available.

Sportsmanship:

- We believe good sportsmanship is vital in athletic competition. But, given the current state of covid-19, both teams will either walk by and give verbal congratulatory remarks or wave towards the other team.
